

The WSET Bursary 2024-25





The WSET Bursary Fund represents a powerful collaboration between WSET's own funding and the generosity of our Drinks Trust donor partners. Thanks to the remarkable efforts of our fundraising team—and a record number of donors who participated—we are proud to share that the **WSET Bursary has supported 173 students in the 2024-25 academic year,** more students than ever before.

Support actively removes financial barriers and opens doors for both current and aspiring professionals across the UK drinks industry. The Drinks Trust are deeply grateful for the continued commitment to making education accessible and inclusive, with a special mention to the educators who go out of their way to ensure a smooth and enjoyable learning experience for DEVELOP students.

This year brought about **growing challenges for the drinks industry**, notably rising costs, declining consumer confidence, and significant changes to employment law. UKHospitality estimates that the on-trade lost 69,000 jobs in the period between October 2024 and May 2025, adding to the sense of volatility in the drinks industry. These pressures affect businesses and individuals—those currently working in the sector, as well as those looking to start a career within it.

The WSET Bursary, administered through DEVELOP by The Drinks Trust, supports individuals in the UK facing financial hardship by offering access to fully funded WSET courses. Eligible students are able to undertake paid-for training with their choice of WSET Approved Programme Provider (APP), as part of a regular class schedule, whilst benefitting from access to the wider suite of financial and wellbeing resources from The Drinks Trust. This initiative enables recipients to pursue qualifications without financial burden, helping to prioritise education and take meaningful steps forward in their careers.

DEVELOP's mission is to alleviate hardship through vocational training whilst supporting a sustainable and equitable talent pipeline for the industry. Many of the graduates from the programme have achieved huge career milestones following bursary support, running venues, starting businesses, working in production or sales, and even teaching about drinks categories themselves.

WSET Bursary **demand remains incredibly high** - indicative of the financial strains we see in the wider industry. DEVELOP aims to meet demand by increasing our fundraising efforts and expanding the programme. For the 2025-26 academic year, DEVELOP will add to the resources available to students, introduce a mentoring programme, and expand to include additional subjects (WSET Beer), donors, and educators.

MEETING DEMAND

The primary goal of the WSET Bursary fund is to *meet demand*. Value of WSET applications received between 2024-25 totals over £175k - this is with little promotional or recruitment efforts - presenting a near £100k funding gap. This clearly illustrates that there is much more demand that could be met.

The DEVELOP WSET Bursary is funded by a collective of nine donors, and delivered by 47 suppliers. The Drinks Trust receive a charitable discount from 66% of the suppliers we work with, streamlining the costs of overheads and human resource, and creating efficiency through pooling the collective capacity of corporate ESG programmes.

Drinks Career Pathways & Business Support







The WSET Bursary forms part of the DEVELOP Programme - which is designed for both working and unemployed individuals, aiming to introduce new, and retain existing, talent. We have partnerships with Job Centres, DWP and local government working to encourage new aspiring drinks professionals. Applications referred by these partners are usually actively unemployed and often prioritise finding employment over achieving qualifications like WSET. DEVELOP's additional short-term training and workshops are available to create a pathway, bridging the gap between unemployment and WSET, by illuminating the abundance of drinks careers and retaining talent within the industry.

In 2024-25 70% of students had industry experience and 70% of students were employed

Economic uncertainty and declining consumer confidence negatively impacts learning and development budgets and, in turn, stagnates career progression. Though DEVELOP caters for the individual, the eligibility criteria helps businesses to comfortably identify team members that might qualify for support without having uncomfortable conversations around financial status - thereby supplementing extra learning and development opportunities for businesses. Where possible, we will take requests from APPs to assess groups to be taught on the same course.

Individuals earning £26k.pa (before TRONC or tips) or less - regardless of employment status - will likely qualify for funding under DEVELOP criteria. Applicants are able to schedule courses to complement their working, personal, or job search schedules.

From DEVELOP and the WSET Bursary fund - and throughout all of TDT services - the aim remains 'to meet demand' and 'for the whole industry to be aware of support available through The Drinks Trust'.

From Drinks Trust analysis, in 2025, I in 5 in the drinks industry will be impacted by financial hardship.

Despite a record numbers of students this academic year, there is more work to do. DEVELOP was forced to disappoint over 100 eligible students as available funding failed to stretch to meet demand. Conversely, we are confident that the current scale of demand is a gross underestimation - in previous years, we have relied very little on promoting the WSET Bursary programme in order to spend funding.

2025-26 will focus on increased visibility and growth of the WSET Bursary throughout promotional efforts, increasing donations by forging new partnerships, and inviting additional educators into the programme.

This next academic year DEVELOP will meet demand of student needs introducing new subjects streams (WSET Beer), offering more specialist workshops (eg. Whisky and Cider tastings), launch a mentoring programme for onward progression, and launch our DEVELOP resources HUB for free additional learning materials available to all students.
